Housing First Program

Stable, safe, affordable housing is one of the biggest barriers victims face on their path to heal and flourish into a survivor. The Housing First program through Live Violence Free, aids qualifying community members with rental assistance, costs associated moving into a new home, utility assistance, furniture costs, child care, while teaching budgeting, meal planning, and cleaning standards and practices. Clients receive survivor driven, trauma informed peer counseling, guidance, and accompanying resources before, during, and after graduating the program.

Crisis Calls



Received and responded to 531 calls from the 24 Hour Crisis Hotline to provided members of the community assistance in emergency situations or to provide information.

Therapy & Counseling



Provided 1,579 therapy & counseling sessions to children, teens, and adults for those affected by domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse.

Shelter & Housing



Accommodated 5,724 bed-nights through the Shelter and Housing Program to individual victims, and in some cases, for their families that were affected by a situation of abuse.

Prevention Education



Instructed 262 prevention education courses within the elementary, middle, and high schools in the Lake Tahoe Unified School District and Alpine County.

Community Helped



Helped 811 unduplicated members of the community by providing services and programs to help these victims evolve into survivors.

Direct: interested volunteers are required to complete the *Crisis Intervention Training* in order to assist with providing services such as peer counseling, advocacy, accompaniment, prevention and assisting with the 24-hour Crisis Line.

In-direct: interested volunteers are able to join the annual fundraiser planning committee, LVF Annual Spring Clean day, assist in community and outreach events, and help with projects within the agency.



Live Violence Free is open to all victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse. Services are free. Our services and programs include a 24-hour crisis line, peer counseling, advocacy and accompaniment, legal assistance, emergency and transitional housing, food, clothing, transportation, emergency response to medical and law enforcement agencies, individual and group therapy, supervised visits and monitored custody exchanges, community outreach and prevention education.
